For example, a nurse with a master's degree can enter into the fields of being a nurse practitioner, certified nurse anesthetist (CRNA), certified nurse midwife (CNM), or a clinical nurse specialist (CNS).

Registered nurses provide direct care to patients, while licensed practical nurses typically provide assistance to doctors or registered nurses. Licensure as a registered nurse is generally sought after graduation from a 4-year undergraduate nursing program and successful completion of the NCLEX-RN, while Licensed Practical Nurses typically only need to complete a 12-14 month post-high school course and the NCLEX-PN. Licensure as a Registered Nurse is generally

a prerequisite both for graduate nursing programs, and for advanced practice or specialty certification.

Registered nurses often work in hospitals or outpatient facilities, where they provide hands-on care to patients by administering medications, managing intravenous lines, observing and monitoring patients' conditions, maintaining records and communicating with doctors. They are also relied upon to give direction and supervision to nurse aides and home health aides. Beyond the physical support and care they provide, registered nurses may provide emotional support to patients and patients' family members. They may educate patients and the general public on disease management, special diet plans and medical conditions, provide information on home care after their treatment and teach individuals how to self-administer medication or complete other self-care tasks.

METHODS AND RESULTS

To get an up-close view of what being a registered nurse is like, the researcher conducted two studies. First is a survey in google forms via gmail for her respondents that is too busy to have an interview for this research. Second is a one-on-one interview with 2 registered nurses.

The researcher conducted a survey using google form and send it to 5 respondents but only received 2 responses.




FIGURE 1: IN SCALE OF 1-10, HOW HAPPY ARE THE RESPONDENTS IN THEIR JOB?
